As a IB Candidate School, MRIS aspires to build an international minded community of responsible, compassionate, reflective and thriving life long learners by creating a safe, inclusive, dynamic learning environment, aimed at holistic development of the learners.

The International Baccalaureate® (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) is for students aged 11–16. The MYP curriculum framework comprises eight subject groups, providing a broad and balanced education for early adolescents.

The MYP requires at least 50 hours of teaching time for each subject group, in each year of the programme. In the final two years of the programme, carefully-defined subject group flexibility allows students to meet local requirements and personal learning goals.

External assessment and recognition

In the final year of the programme, MYP eAssessment provides IB-validated grades based on examinations and course work. Students who undertake external assessment are eligible for MYP course results and the IB MYP Certificate.

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
Teaching and learning in context:

Using global contexts, MYP students develop an understanding of their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet through developmentally appropriate explorations of:

- Personal and cultural expression
- Scientific and technical innovation
- Globalization and sustainability
