PYP is an international curriculum framework designed for children between the age of 3 and 12 years where the whole school community - especially parents - are viewed as valued partners in learning, actively contributing to a well-rounded educational experience.

PYP curriculum framework

The learner

Describes the outcomes for individual students and the outcomes they seek for themselves (what is learning?)

Learning & Teaching

Articulates the distinctive features of learning and teaching (how best to support learners?)

The Learning Community

Emphasizes the importance of the social outcomes of learning & the role that IB communities play in achieving these outcomes (who facilitates learning & teaching?)

Knowledge in PYP is imparted through a programme of inquiry which aims to develop international minded, responsible, global citizens. These units of inquiry focus on one of the 6 trans-disciplinary themes.

Inquiry-Based Conceptual Transdisciplinary Learning

The PYP is organized around the six transdisciplinary themes. Transdisciplinary learning in the PYP conveys learning that has relevance between across and beyond the six subjects as listed below and transcends borders connecting to what is real in the world.
